She embraces the North County's agricultural heritage and supports agricultural technology research and development. In her role as a City Councilwoman, she serve on the San Dieguito River Park JPA and as representative for the City of Escondido at the League of California Cities. In addition, she serves on the Community Advisory Council for San Diego Gas & Electric. She previously served on the Board of Directors for the Voice of San Diego, a non-profit investigative journalism outlet as an alternate to San Diego County Supervisor Greg Cox on the California Coastal Commission.
